### Notes

**Language**  
Portuguese is the official language of Brazil.

**Entry Visa**  
Visas are granted to foreigners arriving in Brazil on a diplomatic mission, official visit, and tourism or business trips. Unaccompanied minors under 18 years of age must carry a travel authorization signed by both parents and notarized. Entry visa requests can be made to Brazilian Consulates. Passports must be valid for at least three months from the date the visa is requested. Tourists from Mercosur countries do not need a visa, but must carry an identity document. For more information about visas, please get in contact with the nearest Brazilian Consulate.

**Electricity**  
Electricity in Brazil is 110V in some states and 220V in others. Please check it at the time of your visit.

**Car Rental**  
Car rental services, with or without a driver, is available at most airports in the country. Advance reservation is recommended. Do not forget to show your international driving permit. Please find out about the driving laws and regulations of the area you are going to visit.

**Tipping**  
Most bars and restaurants include a 10% service surcharge in their bills. It is customary to leave a bit more when service has been satisfactory. When the tip is not included in the bill, it is customary to pay a 10% to 15% tip.

**Currency and Exchange Regime**  
Brazil's monetary unit is the real (R\$) and the exchange rate is published daily in local newspapers and at specialized sites. It is possible to exchange foreign currencies and traveler's checks for reals at banks, traveling agencies and authorized hotels. Credit cards are accepted at most establishments. Brazil adopts a floating exchange rate however, the real has kept stable.

**Taxi**  
We recommend giving priority to registered taxis at airports and around hotels. Taxi drivers do not expect to be tipped. It is common to round up the total to be paid as a reward for good services provided. There are radio-taxi options that can be called by phone and offer air conditioning. Information on radio-taxis can be obtained at hotel receptions.

**Communication**  
To make an international direct call, dial 00 + operator code + country code + area code + telephone number. For direct or collect calls with the help of bilingual operators, please dial 0800 703 2111.

**Time Zone**  
Brazil covers 4 different time zones. Brasilia time (the country's capital city) is the national standard time and is three hours less than Greenwich. In summer, some Brazilian states set the watch ahead.

**Climate and Temperature**  
The country has a predominantly tropical climate with a few variations according with the region. Annual average temperatures are around 28°C (82 F) in the North and 20°C (68 F) in the South.

The archipelago was included on the list of World Natural Heritages.

Its biodiversity, the preservation of extended stretches of the coastal region and the existence of isolated and desert beaches allow the mix of sunshine and beach with nautical, fishing, adventure, ecotourism, among other activities, which add even more flavor to the stories that tourists will cherish forever.

Add all these with a significant variety of services linked to well-being, such as resorts, SPAs, and spaces set apart for rest and relaxation with international standard.

## Barra de Santo Antônio Alagoas



Famous village for its cultural events and its beaches that are characterized by lines of coral reefs close to the shoreline and build natural transparent pools, besides containing a wide range of sea biodiversity. Located in the state of Alagoas, it charms visitors also because of its luxuriant nature that mixes coconut trees and multicolored sea cliffs.



## Rio de Janeiro

Rio de Janeiro was the first Brazilian city to appear on international tourism guides, a rare union between glamour and natural exuberance. From every angle, there are stunning landscapes that add up to the city's contagious joy. In addition to the famous beaches of Copacabana and Ipanema, it is possible to visit lagoons, coves and mountains.



## Ilhabela São Paulo

## Florianópolis Santa Catarina

The island of Florianópolis has over 100 beaches widely varied that can please all visitors: from wild beaches to peaceful ones, in addition to the ones favored by surfers. The famous Lagoa da Conceição is ideal to practice windsurf and kitesurf. Offering good hotels, inns, bars and restaurants, Florianópolis is the favorite destination of thousands of tourists during the Brazilian summer.



## Jericoacoara Ceará



One of the paradises of the Brazilian coast, its beaches show the presence of dunes, lagoons, sandbanks and mangroves in the midst of small fishing villages, an eye-catching combination. The winds between July and November attract surfers, windsurfers, and kite surfers from the whole world. With hotels, charming inns and many bars, its offers a lively nightlife.



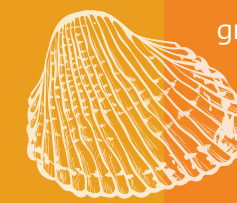
## Itacaré Bahia

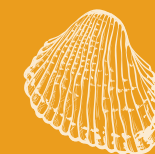


## Praia da Pipa Rio Grande do Norte

One of them, Tambaba beach, is a famous nudist destination. Boats leave Camboinha beach to Areia Vermelha Island, a sandbank that appears at low tide. The quality traditional food and catchy folk art are other attractions.

Located in the city of Ipojuca, famous for its beaches and different landscapes, with stretches in open sea and some others protected by reefs, which build natural pools.
