The Brazilian people is known worldwide for its joy and ability to throw a good party, as it happens at the midyear with the June Festivities.

Most traditional in the north and northeast regions of the country, the June festivals' theme is the country life, so all guests dress up in costumes typical of the countryside of Brazil: men wear straw hats and plaid shirts and women wear colorful dresses, with lace and ruffles.

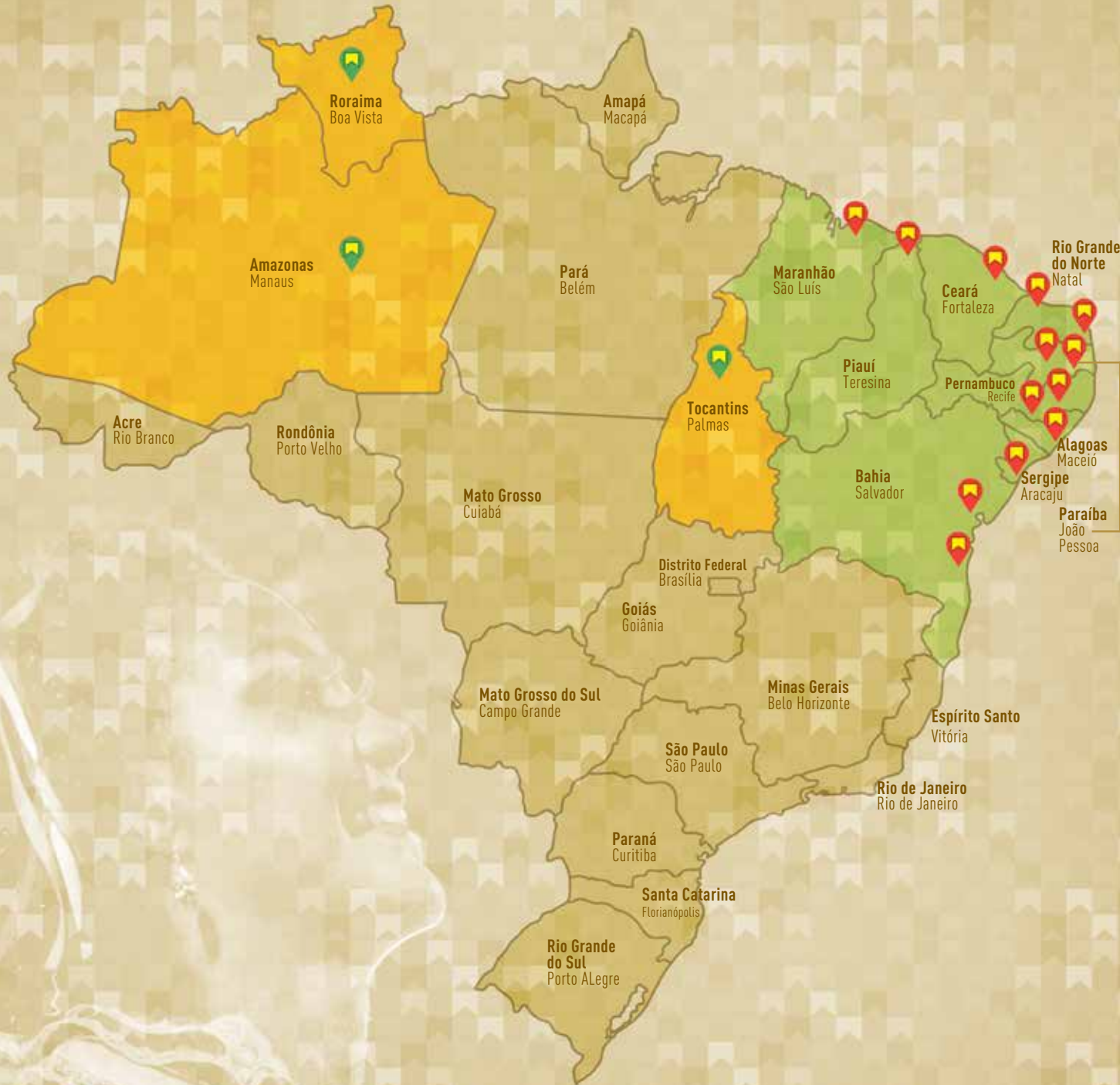
Three Saints are honored all over the country: St. Anthony, St. John and St. Peter are highlighted in colorful and cheerful parties, which also have quite lively songs, such as the *forró*, a very popular rhythm in Brazil, ideal for those who like to dance cheek to cheek.

The party begins at the *arraial*. This is where the square dances – funny dance shows that tell the story of a marriage in the countryside – are presented. The *arraial* is usually adorned with bonfires, banners and fireworks, which give even more light and color to the celebration.

Besides, everybody in Brazil waits all year to feast with the typical foods of the holidays. The menu is rich in corn and peanuts, abundantly harvested this time of year, and brings traditional drinks, in addition to sweet and savory dishes. The cuisine of the June festivals is for all tastes.

PARINTINS

AMAZONAS

A traditional celebration of the northern region of Brazil, the ***Festival Folclórico de Parintins*** is a presentation of thematic regional associations, highlighting the dispute between two folkloric oxen. The *Boi Garantido*, represented by the fans dressed in red, and *Boi Caprichoso*, with the fans dressed in blue. The show depicts indigenous rituals and legends of the Amazon region, by means of allegories and stagings, which enchant thousands of people every year. The festival takes place in the city of Parintins, located in an island in the banks of the Amazonas River, at the Cultural and Sports Center *Amazonino Mendes*, known as *Bumbódromo*. Tourists can stay on boats, family homes or hostels, which makes the experience even more interesting. The festival is held always in the last weekend of June, from Friday to Sunday.

Take the opportunity to know

Tacacá is a delicious broth of the north region of Brazil. Prepared with delicacies such as cassava and shrimps, the broth is served hot in a gourd.

How to get there: By air or land to Manaus, from there to Parintins by plane (about 1:30 of travel) or by boat (about 18 hours of travel). The travel by boat is the favorite of people from the Amazon, who make the crossing over a preview of the party.

BOA VISTA

RORAIMA

Boa Vista, capital of the State of Roraima, awards its visitors with a grand and surprising party, from the musical attractions to its traditions. The festival is divided between the *Arraial Boa Vista Junina*, in June 15 to 23, and the *Arraial do Anauá*, in the second quarter of July. In these events, you can find major attractions of the national music scenario, typical food and the presentation of dance groups, such as the traditional square dance group of Boa Vista, which presents a traditional “wedding celebration”, bride and groom, priest and guests. Only here tourists find such fun. Take the opportunity to dance and enjoy the delicious gastronomic options.

Take the opportunity to know

The **Ilha da Praia Grande** is a small island surrounded by the *Branco* River. Perfect for those who want to go waterskiing and canoeing or just sunbathe and take a dip in the fresh water.

How to get there: By air or land to Boa Vista.

PALMAS TOCANTINS

Palmas has a party ideal for those who want to have fun, dance a lot, and also experience a multitude of typical dishes. The *São João em Palmas* offers a structure for large shows and stalls with typical food, receiving an average of 9 thousand people. Among the attractions, you'll find the *Concurso de Quadrilhas Juninas* (Contest of June Square Dance Groups), and the *Barracão do Forró*, a space reserved for dancing. The contest of the best typical food tent also offers the visitor diversified cuisine. The party lasts for four days, in the month of June. Make your plans so you won't miss the event.

Take the opportunity to know

The **Golden Grass** is taken from the stalk of a flower that symbolizes the region and is the raw material for beautiful jewelry, baskets, fittings and the creativity of local artisans.

How to get there: By air or land to Palmas.

MACEIÓ ALAGOAS

Guaranteed fun with contests, dances and a charming atmosphere. The *De Jacinto a Tororó, São João é em Maceió*, is a large party that attracts on average 28 thousand people per day with shows, square dance contests, and the *coco-de-roda*, a typical dance of the region. Tourists can have fun dancing *farró* in a lively party, with warm reception from the local population. Besides, the city also prepares a scenic village where tourists can walk and have unforgettable experiences. The party takes place in the second quarter of June.

Take the opportunity to know

The beaches **Francês**, **Maragogi** and **Gunga** offer the tourists blue sea, soft white sands and the best infrastructure to ensure fun and an indescribable experience.

How to get there: By air or land to Maceió.

SALVADOR

BAHIA

The Capital of Joy doesn't disappoint when it's party time. The June parties of Salvador turn the city into a real scenery representing the countryside. The scenographic aspect of the streets of **São João no Pelourinho** contributes to the formation of the climate of an *arraial*. In June 20 to 30, hundreds of attractions are distributed in eight stages. There are large parties and also attractions for people of all ages, even children, which have a specific square to enjoy the best of the June Festivals. The square dance contest is a show in itself, with breathtaking colors and lights that thrill whoever watches it. Lovers of typical drinks can delight in the party's specialties: liqueurs of fruits, especially of *jenipapo* and the *quentões* (hot beverages made with *cachaça*).

Take the opportunity to know

Historic Center of Salvador

Salvador has a lot to tell. In addition to being the first Brazilian capital, the city is a meeting point of African, European and Amerindian cultures, reflected in its Historic Center.

How to get there: By air or land to Salvador.

AMARGOSA BAHIA

A warm party, with lively music and good *forró* lessons, you'll find at the ***São João em Amargosa***. Called the *Cidade Jardim* (Garden City), because of its beautiful trees and pleasant climate, Amargosa has one of the liveliest June festivals of Bahia. In addition to dancing *forró* at the *Praça Bosque*, tourists can visit the replicas of rural villages and enjoy the traditional Northeastern music, played by the region's traditional *forró* groups. The artists performing on the main stage of the event attract about 60 thousand people per day to the town square. On top of that, those present at the Amargosa party can also enjoy the delicious traditional dishes, with special attention to recipes with salted meat. The party takes place in the second quarter of June.

Take the opportunity to know

Serra do Timbó

Measuring 800 m of height, the *Serra do Timbó* awards visitors with waterfalls, peaks, forests and an infrastructure that ensures security and an indescribable experience.

How to get there: By air or land to Salvador. From there by bus to Amargosa (approximately 240 km distant from Salvador).

FORTALEZA

CEARÁ

Fortaleza offers more than a São João party, it offers a whole city prepared for a big party. The **Festejo Ceará Junino** is the state's main June event. The finals of the square dance contests, for example, take place in Fortaleza, after 21 regional phases, gathering the best groups of the State. And there are also shows and *farró*. The party receives around 6 thousand people per day and happens from June 1 to July 15. Besides the party, tourists also find many cultural options in theaters, museums, bars and restaurants of Fortaleza, guaranteeing fun for a long time.

Take the opportunity to know

Jijoca de Jericoacoara

Beaches, historical sights and contact with nature in the region:
Jijoca de Jericoacoara offers its tourists all this and much more.

How to get there: By air or land to Fortaleza.

SÃO LUÍS MARANHÃO

The strength of the ***Festas em São Luís***, capital of the State of Maranhão, lies in the folk dances, such as the *Tambor de Crioula*, and the *Cacuriá*, *Caroço*, *Lelê* and *Coco* dances, that enchant visitors with their strength and beauty, and also the *Bumba Meu Boi*, one of the most outstanding cultural events in the country. The tradition starts in the 18th century and still involves the population of São Luís that, during the second quarter of June, occupies the entire city, dancing and singing into the night. In addition to watching the traditional performances of square dances and shows with local singers, the tourist can wear the costumes of one of the characters and be photographed to appear on the event's official website and on social networks. Plan your visit to this big party.

Take the opportunity to know

Lençóis Maranhenses National Park

Considered one of the most charming landscapes of Brazil, the *Lençóis Maranhenses* has 155 thousand hectares of crystal clear lagoons and grand dunes, which reach up to 50 m tall.

How to get there: By air or land to São Luís.

JOÃO PESSOA

PARAÍBA

The capital of Paraíba has a whole week of celebrations and joy for those who come to one of the country's biggest June Festivals. The party ***São João Pra Valer***, which happens at the end of June, has 150 attractions, dance groups *repentistas* (typical singers), guitarists, square dances and even a handicraft fair. The joy is such that it is impossible not to want to dance and have fun to the sound of musical attractions, savoring traditional dishes. João Pessoa has large June centers, divided between the historic center and five other neighborhoods. There are parties the whole week. Make your plans and remember to be in the mood to enjoy each one of the attractions.

Take the opportunity to know

Ponta do Seixas

Famous for being the easternmost point of the Americas, the *Ponta do Seixas* awards tourists with a beach of fine sand and blue sea and spectacular landscapes.

How to get there: By air or land to João Pessoa.

CAMPINA GRANDE

PARAÍBA

In an event that has been going on for 30 years, the tradition and joy make this party an unforgettable moment. The *São João em Campina Grande* attracts around 60 thousand tourists per day. The party takes place throughout the month of June, mainly in the week from June 18 to 25, with the presence of Brazilian artists and square dance groups, with countless gastronomic options. If you want to know a massive June festival, you must come here.

Take the opportunity to know

The **Arraial do Sítio São João** is a life-size scene of a rural 19th century village, complete with rustic furniture, pens, police stations, posts with kerosene lighting and lots of fun for the family.

How to get there: By air or land to João Pessoa, then from there to Campina Grande by plane or by bus (approximately 135 km from João Pessoa).

RECIFE PERNAMBUCO

A real show takes the whole city with the colors and the joy of the party *São João Torcida Recife*. In Recife, a scenic city is prepared to engage visitors with *forró*, square dance groups, decoration with colored flags and banners of the Saints honored spread everywhere. The population participates in the festivities in the contests of decorated streets and stylized square dance groups that represent their neighborhoods. The party *São João Torcida Recife* takes place throughout the month of June, with the best parties from 12 to 24 of June, and it attracts around 150 thousand people per day. To be received and live unforgettable moments: this is what those who travel to Recife for the June Festivities find.

Take the opportunity to know

Historical and Cultural World Heritage, **Olinda** was baptized from the interjection: "Oh! Linda!" (Oh, beautiful!). Its attractions range from beautiful churches and mansions to tasty gastronomic options.

How to get there: By air or land to Recife.

CARUARU

PERNAMBUCO

An opportunity to experience life in the Brazilian countryside with all the refinement of a grand party. This is the party *São João em Caruaru*, which takes place throughout the month of June, especially between June 12 and 24. The *Pátio do Forró*, where the event takes place, is a scenic town, a replica of a small countryside town, with restaurants, bars, stalls, stage structure for shows of Brazilian artists and even the so-called “giant food festivals” in which the typical dishes of the party are found in sizes much larger than the usual. Join this great celebration and be surprised with the experiences you can only find here.

Take the opportunity to know

The **Feira de Caruaru** comprises more than 90 thousand square meters where tourists can buy typical souvenirs from Pernambuco while enjoying snacks and fresh fruit.

How to get there: By air or land to Recife. From there to Caruaru by bus (approximately 140 km from Recife).

TERESINA

PIAUI

A whole city stops to prepare the largest party of the State, one of the largest in Brazil. Joy, regional music and lots of dance. This is how the party ***Folgedos de Teresina***, the largest popular party of Piauí, carried out for 37 years, happens. The event happens on the 10 last days of June and brings together cultural displays from several states of the country, such as the *Bumba Meu Boi*, the sound of national rhythms such as the *carimbó* and the *xaxado*, and a lively square dance contest. There is also a space for dancing *farró*, with a dance floor specially designed for the visiting public to dance and participate. Choose your partner and get ready for lots of dance and fun in Teresina.

Take the opportunity to know

Water mirrors, dunes, wildlife, rivers and beaches, with the sun shining bright all year.
That's the scenario that the tourist will find in the **Delta do Parnaíba**.

How to get there: By air or land to Teresina.

NATAL

RIO GRANDE DO NORTE

Those who arrive in Natal for the ***Festival de Quadrilhas de Natal*** is involved by a tradition of complete June celebrations. The party is long-awaited by the population throughout the year. It stirs several neighborhoods of the city with the traditional square dance groups, tents with typical gastronomy and *forró*. The highlight is the ***Forraço Festival***, the biggest music competition of Rio Grande do Norte, with many presentations every day. The winners are chosen at the *grande final*, on June 24. In Natal, tourists find a whole city ready to celebrate. Come up and enjoy everything that this party has to offer.

Take the opportunity to know

Praia de Ponta Negra

That's where the *Morro do Careca* is found, a dune 100 m high in an indescribable landscape, with natural pools and an infrastructure with inns and restaurants.

MOSSORÓ

RIO GRANDE DO NORTE

In Mossoró there's fun for all tastes: from cuisine to music, the options are varied and joy prevails. At **Mossoró Cidade Junina** tourists will find Brazilian attractions, square dance festivals, typical food, a contest of accordionists, a festival of ten-string guitar players and a humor festival, in addition to the play *Chuva de Bala no País de Mossoró*, that takes place in front of the *São Vicente* Church - historic stage of the confrontation between the townspeople and the Gang of *Lampião*, name given to the fearless brigand's group who terrorized the Brazilian hinterland at the beginning of the last century. Make your plans and come enjoy all attractions of this great party.

Take the opportunity to know

Memorial da Resistência

With an open air museum, the thematic square honors the heroes who resisted the invasion of the Gang of *Lampião*, in addition to being a location for art exhibitions and recitals.

How to get there: By air or land to Natal. From there to Mossoró by bus (approximately 285 km from Natal).

ARACAJU

SERGIPE

Who comes to Aracaju finds many entertainment options. The main celebrations of the city are the ***Forró Caju***, with two stages where great attractions of the Brazilian and regional music perform, and the ***Arraial do Povo***, with a scenic town where folklore groups, ten-string guitar players and singers perform. There are square dance presentations, folklore groups and thematic *forró* shows – where tourists can learn to dance – in both parties. Another major attraction is the ***Concurso de Quadrilhas da Rua São João*** (square dance contest of São João Street), emblematic celebration of the State of Sergipe, with more than 100 years of tradition. Access to events is simple and the infrastructure of the city is considered one of the best in the country. The parties go from May 31 to June 30. Get ready and enjoy all the options that Aracaju has to offer.

Take the opportunity to know

The **Orla de Atalaia** has 6 km of hotels, bars and restaurants in a shoreline with a beautiful lake, multisport area and a leisure complex opened overnight, thanks to its special lighting.

How to get there: By air or land to Aracaju.

ESTÂNCIA SERGIPE

A fireworks show and a lot of dancing: that's what tourists will find at the party ***São João em Estância***, in the State of Sergipe. The party takes place on the streets, with bonfires assembled by the population, and also at the *Praça da Matriz*, with square dance and the *Dança do pisa-pólvora* (gunpowder-stepping dance), a typical cultural manifestation of Estância, where the gunpowder is prepared for the fireworks shows and the "fire boat races". Everything is handled with total security for visitors. There is also a special area called *farródromo*, where *farró* groups and square dance groups make presentations to the audience. The party takes place throughout the month of June. Bring your enthusiasm and a camera to enjoy and register the moment.

Take the opportunity to know

Voted as one of the 100 most beautiful beaches in the world, the **Praia do Saco** is considered an ecological sanctuary, offering the tourist thin sand and the deep blue of the Atlantic Ocean.

How to get there: By air or land to Aracaju, and from there to Estância by bus (approximately 66 km from Aracaju).
